TEN GOAL THRILLER AT SURBITON

Surbiton started the defence of their Men's Hockey League Premier Division title with a stunning 6-4 home win over Holcombe. The 2020 champions, denied the opportunity for a full defence in 2021 due to COVID-19, fell behind to Tom Russell's eighth minute goal, before Rob Farrington equalised nine minutes before half time. Nick Bandurak restored Holcombe's lead six minutes later, but with no indication of the second half goal-fest to come.

Gareth Furlong brought Surbiton level for a second time ten minutes into the second half, only for Holcombe to open up a 4-2 lead with goals in the 47th and 48th minutes through Jake Owen and Tom O'Keefe. Surbiton scored four goals in the last twenty minutes, Farrington starting the comeback in the 50th minute.

Luke Taylor equalised in the 54th minute to make the score 4-4 and leave all to play for. David Goodfield gave Surbiton the lead for the first time with four minutes remaining, Taylor slotting home from the penalty spot in the penultimate minute to clinch the 6-4 victory.

History was made as the University of Durham achieved their first-ever win in the top flight at the expense of Brooklands Manchester University. Jacob Schmidt gave Durham the lead, only for Alex Holmes to equalise early in the second half. Raunaq Rai was Durham's history maker as Brooklands went down 2-1.

The other promoted team from 2019-20, Oxted, were also victorious, reversing last season's opening day scoreline by winning 2-1 at local rivals East Grinstead. Owen Williamson scored both Oxted goals either side of Louis Gittens' effort for the hosts.

Hampstead & Westminster kept up their winning run at London rivals, Wimbledon with a 3-2 victory. Hampstead were cruising at half time after Matt Guise-Brown scored a hat-trick, but Wimbledon fought back in the second half, Evan Kimber and Ben Francis giving the visitors some anxious moments before Hampstead held on to record their fourth successive victory at Wimbledon.

Old Georgians showed that once again they are going to be a force to reckon with after a 4-0 home win over Beeston. Sam Ward scored a brace against his former club with James Tindall and Ed Carson also contributing towards the win.

SURBITON FACE INTRIGUING MATCH AT OXTED

Surbiton face an intriguing trip to Oxted on Sunday, having surprisingly lost there 1-0 in what turned out to be both teams' last league match of 2020-21.

Oxted's scorer that evening was Tim Guise-Brown and having moved to Holcombe for the 2021-22 season, was in a unique position last Sunday as his new club were winning 4-3 at the end of the third quarter. However, a stunning fourth quarter comeback robbed Guise-Brown of the achievement of being on different winning teams against the same club in successive matches as Surbiton won 6-4 in a goal-fest.

Last weekend, Oxted won 2-1 at local rivals East Grinstead for their first-ever away win in the Premier Division and will go into the rematch with Surbiton with confidence as Owen Williamson may prove to be a worthy replacement after a brace of penalty corner conversions.

East Grinstead face a daunting trip to Hampstead & Westminster, where they haven't won since October 2014, when they came out on top 6-3. Since then, Hampstead have won three of the last five encounters including a 5-1 victory in October 2020. Only a 2-2 draw in October 2017 and a goalless draw in 2015-16 has interrupted Hampstead's run since the West Sussex club's last success in Central London.

Hampstead were cruising 3-0 at Wimbledon at half time in last week's match, but weathered a second half comeback to retain the points with a 3-2 win.

Wimbledon head to Beeston who were taught a lesson by Old Georgians last weekend, returning to Nottingham with a 4-0 defeat against their name. Since Wimbledon were promoted from the Conference East in 2012-13, they have won four of seven matches away to Beeston with the home club winning two and drawing one. Beeston won the last time, 3-2 in 2019-20 and the team's only meeting in 2020-21 came at Wimbledon where the teams drew 3-3.

Old Georgians have this week off.

The University of Exeter start their campaign this week and make the long trip to Brooklands Manchester University, where they have won twice and lost once in three visits.

Since their return to the top flight in 2018-19, Exeter have won on both occasions in the North West, 3-1 in March 2019 and 3-2 in February 2020. The only other Premier Division meeting was back in September 2009, when Brooklands won 1-0. Brooklands also beat Exeter 1-0 in the opening match of the 2011-12 Promotion Tournament in Olton and ultimately replaced Exeter in the Premier Division after Exeter had finished ninth.

The final match-up between Holcombe and the University of Durham will see the teams meet for the first time. Durham made history with their 2-1 win over Brooklands as it was their first-ever victory in the Premier Division. Durham were promoted to the national league when the Conferences were introduced in 2008-09 and remained a member of the Conference North until Division One North was introduced as the second tier, and then proceeded to finish top of Division One at the first attempt and won promotion with Oxted after the proposed playoff system was cancelled after a 17 game regular season.

Holcombe are yet to reach their full potential in the Premier Division even though they finished top of the Premier Division table at the first attempt in 2015-16, only to lose the semi-final to Wimbledon after going through the regular season unbeaten.

Holcombe v University of Durham

No previous meetings

Holcombe have not met the University of Durham since Durham were promoted to the England Hockey League for the 2008-09 season, the first of the Conference structure seasons.

Durham remained in the Conference North until Division One North was introduced as the second tier, finishing top at the end of a 17 game season to join Oxted in an expanded Premier Division for what was intended to be a temporary situation until Covid-19 hit and forced the 2020-21 season to be abandoned.

Last Sunday was historic for Durham as they celebrated their first ever top flight victory, 2-1 at home to Brooklands Manchester University.

Holcombe won promotion to the Premier Division, finishing second behind Kent rivals, Canterbury in the 2014-15 Promotion Tournament. Holcombe have since established themselves in the top flight without winning the league title, although they made an immediate impact in 2015-16, finishing top of the regular season Premier Division table, without losing a game, only for fourth placed Wimbledon to beat them 3-2 in the Championship semi-finals at Lee Valley.

Surbiton were shocked in their last Premier Division match of the 2020-21 season when Oxted, newly promoted after winning Division One South in 2019-20, ended Surbiton's one hundred per cent record for the season and also ended Surbiton's run of 108 regular season games of scoring at least one goal in a match, since East Grinstead had won 4-0 in West Sussex in October 2014.

Previous meetings between the clubs had been in the Men's Cup, Surbiton scraping through in 2007-8 3-1 on penalties after a 1-1 draw at Oxted County School.

In 2012-13, Surbiton won 6-1 at Sugden Road in the semi-final before going on to beat Hampstead & Westminster 3-1 at Wakefield Hockey Club to lift the Men's Cup.
