HAMPSTEAD BEAT CLIFTON TO GO FOUR POINTS CLEAR

With Surbiton and East Grinstead absent due to competition in Europe, Hampstead & Westminster took the opportunity to open up a four point gap at the top of the Vitality Women's Hockey League Premier Division with a 3-1 win at Clifton Robinsons.

After a goalless first half, Lauren Turner broke the deadlock in the 45th minute from the penalty spot. Esme Burge doubled Hampstead's lead five minutes later with Sarah Robertson putting the icing on the cake eight minutes from time. Holly Munro scored Clifton's penalty corner consolation in added on time at the end of the game, but Hampstead avenged the 5-4 defeat on their last visit.

Buckingham moved up to second after Jo Day's goal, two minutes before half time, proved to be the winner against Loughborough Students, who are bottom, a point behind Holcombe, but with a game in hand.

The University of Birmingham are third after their 4-2 home win against Swansea. Birmingham had to come from behind after Sara Davies gave the Welsh club a third minute lead. Lily Walker equalised in the 24th minute, before Swansea were swamped by three goals in eleven minutes in the second half as Millie Attwell in the 41st minute and Carter Ayars in the 48th, both converted penalty corners and Becky Manton scored Birmingham's fourth goal in the 52nd minute. Having opened the scoring, Swansea completed it, Rebecca Treharne notching Swansea's second goal with 15 minutes remaining as the teams met for the first time since 2008-09.

Wimbledon won their first match of the season, 2-0 at home to Holcombe and made a lightning start, Eliza Brett scoring in the second minute. Lucy Holder then sealed the win in the 54th minute from a penalty corner.

East Grinstead finished fourth out of five teams in the EuroHockey Club Trophy in Lille, France. After an 8-1 thrashing by Gantoise in their opening match, hosts, Lille were beaten 7-0, but subsequent defeats to Sanse Complutense (4-3) and Braxgata (5-0) left East Grinstead disappointed.

Surbiton had little preparation before their EHL Ranking Cup final against hosts UHC Hamburg, having been given a 5-0 forfeit by Irish club, Pegasus in the scheduled semi-final. UHC beat HC Minsk 2-1 in their semi-final and went on to lift the cup with a 2-0 victory over Surbiton, Amy Costello scoring both goals from penalty corners to experience immediate success after joining the German club from East Grinstead.

SURBITON & EAST GRINSTEAD ARE BACK FROM EUROPE

Surbiton and East Grinstead return to domestic action this weekend after competing in the Euro Hockey League and the EuroHockey Club Trophy respectively. In their absence, Hampstead & Westminster opened up a four point gap over second placed Buckingham.

Hampstead welcome the University of Birmingham to Paddington Recreation Ground and will want to carry on where they left off in 2019-20, when they completed a league double including a 3-0 home win. Birmingham are likely to face a tougher task against the league leaders than in the last two weeks, when they drew 2-2 at Holcombe and beat Swansea 4-2 at home.

Second placed Buckingham take on Surbiton at Sugden Road, where they lost 3-0 on the opening day of last season. Buckingham last won in Elmbridge in November 2017 when they triumphed 2-1 thanks to goals from Kitty Higgins and Lauren Thomas, since when Surbiton have won on Buckingham's last three visits.

East Grinstead, having had their 22 game unbeaten run ended at Hampstead and having lost three of their four games in Europe, will want to recapture their form when they travel to Nottingham Hockey Centre to face Beeston, who have lost all five Premier Division meetings and failed to score in two attempts at home against East Grinstead. Sophie Bray has scored for East Grinstead in all five encounters and will be keen to keep her run going. Beeston come back after having a bye last week.

Wimbledon cross the Welsh border to take on Swansea for the first time since November 2006 when Swansea [City] won 5-2 in the National South Division. Swansea made the return trip in March 2007 when Swansea won 4-2, but were not quite so fortunate last season when the Welsh club made their top flight debut in South West London but lost

4-0. Swansea are looking for their first ever Premier Division win this season, having earned their first point in a 1-1 home draw with Buckingham.

Holcombe entertain Clifton Robinsons with both teams still without a win so far this season after three games. Clifton haven't won at Holcombe Park since November 2014, when due to a quirk in the fixture list, the teams met twice in thirteen days, Clifton completing a league double. Holcombe have won three and drawn two of the last five meetings in Kent and will be hoping to continue their winning ways to pull away from the bottom of the table.

Loughborough Students, currently bottom of the table after losing both their games, are without a game this weekend.

Wimbledon were Swansea's first ever opponents in the Premier Division, both teams having been automatically promoted after being top of Division One South and Division One North respectively when due to Covid-19, the season was halted after 17 games and the planned promotion play-offs were cancelled.

When the teams last met in the national league in 2006-07, Swansea City (who merged with Swansea University in 2018 to form the current Swansea club) did the double over a Wimbledon side destined to be relegated and descend to South Clubs' Women's Hockey League Division Two before they started the comeback which saw them back in the top flight in 2020-21 for the first time since 1992-93.
